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Abstract:

Despite close interactions between learning and personality research in the mid-20th century, there has been little interaction between these research fields in recent years. Nevertheless, there is much that the two research fields can learn from each other. The current special collection encompasses conceptual, theoretical, and empirical papers about the interplay between learning and personality, with a focus on basic learning phenomena such as habituation and conditioning and basic personality traits such as those considered in Reinforcement Sensitivity Theory, the Big Five, the HEXACO, or other personality frameworks.

Additional information on the process

Journal selection. We oriented towards the *Collabra: Psychology* journal as this is a well-regarded journal (Q1 in WoS Psychology: Multidisciplinary category, according to the AIS factor), being also very committed to open science and replicability/transparency principles, giving access both to research articles and the accompanying data and code.

Announcement of the issue. We advertised the special issues in the targeted academic communities belonging to personality and learning psychologists (i.e., the periodic newsletter of the European Association of Personality Psychology). We also contacted via email people who participated or were invited but could not attend the Expert Meeting on Personality and Learning held at Timisoara in May 2022. Other advertising channels were the journal website, the project website, and social media posts.

Review process. Each of the four editors served as action editors for two or more manuscripts using the Scholastica platform used by *Collabra: Psychology*. This involved searching for reviewers, providing manuscript feedback, and deciding whether to accept or reject manuscripts for publication.

Current status (Sep 30, 2023): The issue is closed now. It contains eight empirical papers and one introductory paper. All empirical papers are published, as you can notice above. The introductory paper has been accepted for publication but has no DOI assigned up to this moment.
